A variety of genres are discussed at the **First Colony Book Group**, which meets on the fourth Wednesday of every month, beginning at 1:30 pm, in the Meeting Room. The discussion on **February 22** will be on *A Thousand Splendid Suns*, a novel written by Khaled Hosseini.

The **Amiga Book Club**, a discussion group for Spanish-speaking readers, meets on the last Thursday of the month, beginning at 12:00 noon, in the Conference Room. The **February 23** discussion will be on *Antigua Vida Mía*, written by Marcela Serrano.
