RECOMMENDED ROSES

Roses may only be planted as an accent shrub. They cannot take the place of screening shrubs. They may also be planted in the rear yards where not visible from public view.

Suggested Varieties – Accent Shrubs Only

Caldwell Pink

This rose has double, lilac-pink flowers forming clusters that can be seen from a distance. The compact bush fills out nicely with a minimum of pruning and maintenance. It is not very particular about soil conditions, but prefers a sunny, open space. (Repeat blooming, pink blend).

Katy Road Pink

This rose forms an open, yet extremely graceful bush. It appears to have few insect or disease problems and is not particular about soil or growing conditions. It is remarkably free-blooming with new buds appearing all the time. The large-petaled, vivid pink flowers are semi-double, opening from long buds to display their central stamens. Large orange hips, three to five feet. (Repeat blooming, fragrant, hip display, medium pink).

Georgetown Tea

This flower is long-budded and fully double - dark salmon pink at the center fading to lilac pink. The petals roll into points at the tips as they unfold, giving the fully open flower a starry look. The blooms have typical Tea fragrance, and the foliage is extra thick and attractive, three to five feet. (Repeat blooming, fragrant, pink blend).

Ducher, 1869

Regarded as the only white China rose, Ducher blooms a soft, ivory-white. The buds are very round and sometimes have a hint of pink on the outer petals. Although it exhibits the typical bronzy new growth, the foliage of 'Ducher' is uncharacteristically light green, three to five feet. (Repeat blooming, fragrant, white).

Martha Gonzales

Bright scarlet, neat, single flowers open flat to decorate a bushy shrub whose neat foliage has a dark red tinge. Due to size, it serves as an excellent choice for a low hedge or border, two to three feet. (Repeat blooming, medium red).

Old Blush

Also known as 'Common Monthly,' 'Common Blush China,' 'Old Pink Daily,' 'Old Pink Monthly,' and 'Parsons Pink China.' 'Old Blush' has medium, semi-double, lilac pink flowers in loose clusters. They flush darker pink in the sun and are followed by large orange hips. The bush is full and upright in habit, growing slowly to more than five feet, with neat, healthy foliage, three to six feet. (Repeat blooming, fragrant, hip display, medium pink).

La Mame

The perfect hedge plant, 'La Mame' is a neat, erect bush heavily covered with healthy, shiny leaves, which reblooms heavily. 'La Mame' prefers open, sunny areas, four to six feet. (Repeat blooming, fragrant, pink blend).

Marie Pavie

This rose can be used as a border, pot plant, specimen, or low hedge. Pale pink buds unfold to creamy white, fragrant, semi-double flowers. This rose is almost constantly in bloom, and the wonderful scent permeates the garden on warm days. The foliage is a dark, rich, healthy green. The thornless stems of 'Marie Pavie' make this rose an outstanding landscape plant, three to four feet. (Repeat blooming, fragrant, white).

APPROVED PLANT LIST

The following plants are recommended and have been selected due to their hardiness in our area. Most of these plants also have low water requirements once established. Plant species not specified on this approved plant palette may be considered on an individual basis.

Shrubs: Abelia, Aspidistra, Boxwood, Dwarf Crapemyrtle, Dwarf Wax Myrtle, Holly, Indian Hawthorn, Ligustrum, Nandina, Pittosporum, Dwarf Oleander, Viburnum, Yaupon, Dwarf Barbados Cherry, Dwarf Bottlebrush, Loropetulum, Rosemary, Juniper

Groundcovers, Border Plants, Vines: Asian Jasmine, Agapanthus, Aztec Grass, Boxwood, Daylily, Liriope, Mondo Grass, Society Garlic, Carolina Jessamine, Confederate (Star) Jasmine, Honeysuckle, Climbing Roses, Evergreen Wisteria, English Ivy, Algerian Ivy, Virginia Creeper


Seasonal Color (Annuals): Begonia, Calendula, Dianthus, Geranium, Hibiscus, Impatiens, Marigold, Pansy, Snapdragon, Viola, Periwinkle, Petunia, Portulaca, Salvia, Zinnia, Penta, Gomphrena, Stock

Seasonal Color (Perennials): Caladium, Daylily, Geranium, Hibiscus, Lantana, Mexican Heather, Salvia, Coneflower, Rudbeckia, Bulbine, Butterfly Iris

Optional Accent Shrubs: Variegated Ginger, Buddleia, Sago Palm, Beautyberry, Roses: Caldwell Pink, Katy Road Pink, Georgetown Tea, Ducher, Martha Gonzales, Old Blush, La Marne, Marie Pavie, Mrs. R.M. Finch, The Fairy, Nearly Wild, Rise N' Shine (also see supplemental page on "Roses in your Landscape")
